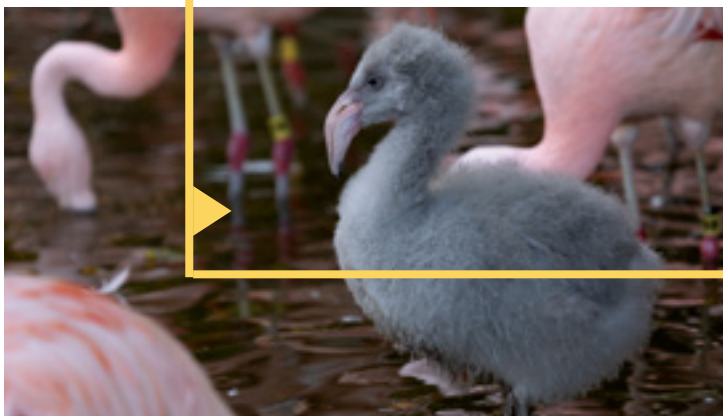
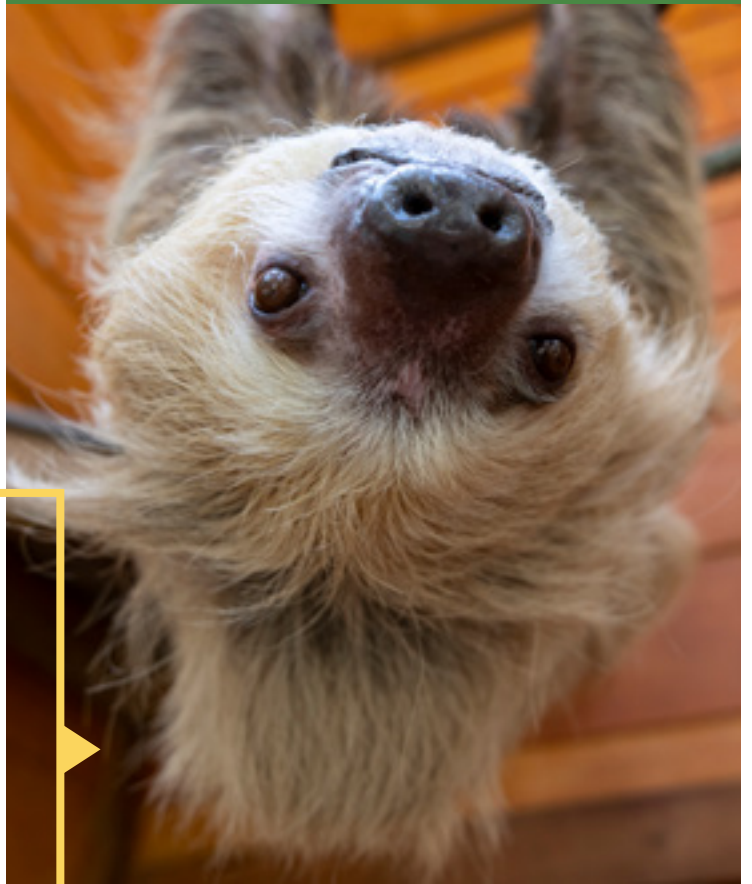

Forward-thinking SCIENCE

A key commitment outlined in the **Zoo Atlanta Strategic Plan**, scientific research is one of the many attributes that show the world where Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) zoos fit into the big picture of science and conservation.

What we learn improves a global body of knowledge in animal biology and behavior; conservation; and professional animal care. Since 1978, Zoo Atlanta team members and academic partners have been responsible for **more than 420 peer-reviewed publications**, often appearing in some of the world's most prestigious scientific journals.

The **10 studies published in 2023** explored environmental enrichment (examining the gorillas' use of a new forage feeder); species biology (elephant trunk mechanics); animals' use of space (sidewinder rattlesnakes); native wildlife (behavior of foxes in urban areas vs. rural areas); and more.

Two critically endangered bog turtles hatched on March 1 and 2.

The hatches represented a notable breeding success for Zoo Atlanta and this rare Georgia native species, which is found only in the imperiled mountain bog ecosystem.

A Visible PLEDGE

Opened in the first week of April, the Zoo Atlanta Explorer Store tells the story of Zoo Atlanta's commitment to leading by example in preserving our natural resources. The shopping experience is managed by the Zoo's retail partner Event Network, which is committed to featuring eco-friendly and sustainable gifts that support environmental sustainability, provide opportunities for local artisans, and benefit conservation organizations.

A notable centerpiece of the store is Big Tim, a "tusker" African elephant made entirely of recycled flip-flops by Ocean Sole Africa.

A Greener RIDE

Riders on the Norfolk Southern Zoo Train did so with a cleaner environmental footprint with a new green train engine that was installed in 2023. The engine was made possible by a gift in memory of longtime Zoo Atlanta Docent and volunteer train engineer Ernest D. Key Jr.

The train engine replacement was one of numerous **capital investments** undertaken throughout the Zoo during the year, not just in terms of sustainability and guest experience, but notably in terms of **animal area upgrades**. These included but were not limited to new climbing structures in the giant panda dayrooms; improvements to ambassador animal housing areas; upgrades to the Patagonian mara habitat; and replacement of the skylights in the gorilla building.

Celebrating a **LEGACY**

Zoo Atlanta commemorated the birth of Willie B. III and the uniquely Atlanta legacy of his grandfather, Willie B., at **Willie B. Day** on June 18. Throughout the summer, fans were encouraged to share their memories of the late icon, who figured prominently in the childhoods of generations of Atlantans. 2023 marked the 35th anniversary of Willie B.'s first entrance into the naturalistic Ford African Rain Forest on May 13, 1988, after 27 years in an indoor environment. Over the years until his passing in 2000, he became a symbol of the transformation of Zoo Atlanta.



An Innovative **TREK**

As guests enjoyed sightings of the newest member of the Zoo Atlanta gorilla population, Memorial Day weekend brought a new opportunity to observe gorillas in the wild—without ever leaving a seat at the Zoo—when **Gorilla Trek: A 360° Ride Film** opened in partnership with Immotion.

Narrated by Tara Stoinski, PhD, President and CEO and Chief Scientific Officer of the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund, the virtual reality experience uses VR goggles and moving seats to simulate a 10,000-foot trek into the jungle of Rwanda to observe a troop of elusive mountain gorillas.

Breaking Ground for the **FUTURE**

On July 27, Zoo Atlanta announced construction of **The Rollins Animal Health Center**.

Named in recognition of The Gary W. Rollins Foundation's generous investment of \$3 million in the project and long history of support, the new veterinary complex will redefine standards of excellence in zoo animal medicine, state-of-the-art technology, research, and academic partnerships. The ceremonial groundbreaking featured special remarks from Honorary Capital Campaign Chair Mayor Andre Dickens.

Prior to beginning construction, Zoo Atlanta had already raised nearly \$21 million toward a \$22 million goal for the **Care, Conserve, Connect capital campaign**—a notable demonstration of support from the philanthropic community. In addition to the gift from The Gary W. Rollins Foundation, donations of \$1 million or more included gifts from Lettie Pate Evans Foundation; Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation; A Friend of the Zoo; The Marcus Foundation; The Sara Giles Moore Foundation; and The Zeist Foundation.

The Rollins Animal Health Center is slated to be completed for occupancy by the Veterinary Team in summer 2024.

The oldest great ape at Zoo Atlanta at 52, Biji arrived at the Zoo in 1988 as part of an original group of orangutans from the **Emory National Primate Research Center**.

Professional Development for **EXCELLENCE** in animal care

The Zoo Atlanta Animal Care and Veterinary Teams are renowned for consistently going above and beyond for the well-being of the animals in their stewardship. In September, the Zoo was pleased to host the world's preeminent experts in hoof care, the **Zoo Hoofstock Trim Program**, for a three-day workshop for animal care professionals working with the Zoo's hoofed species.

Team members learned about anatomy; hoof growth; preventative care; and hoof maintenance; and participated in a practical application in hoof trimming. Ongoing positive reinforcement training efforts allow animals to voluntarily engage in maintenance procedures that enable them to participate in their own comprehensive care.

The Orangutan Species Survival Plan® (SSP) recommended that Nangka, an infant Sumatran orangutan born at another AZA zoo, travel to Zoo Atlanta when it became apparent that his biological mother was not providing appropriate maternal care. In one of the year’s most heartwarming stories, in the days following his arrival in Atlanta on September 8, Nangka was adopted by Zoo Atlanta’s “supermom,” Madu, making him her fifth adopted infant.

An impact on four **CONTINENTS**

Zoo Atlanta's mission, **We save wildlife and their habitats through conservation, research, education, and engaging experiences**, has an impact far beyond the borders of the Zoo. **Species on four continents** benefited from conservation programs and partnerships supported by Zoo Atlanta in 2023.

In addition to two significant signature partnerships with **Conservation South Luangwa**, based in Zambia, and the **Golden Lion Tamarin Association** in Brazil, Zoo Atlanta provided direct support for conservation programs in Africa, Asia, South America, and at home in North America.

The Zoo's **Quarters for Conservation** initiative benefited the **Chinchilla Conservation Project** (Chile); the **Sloth Conservation Project** (Costa Rica); and the **AZA North American Songbird SAFE** (Saving Animals from Extinction) **Program**.

The **Mabel Dorn Reeder Conservation Endowment Fund**, which allows Zoo Atlanta to further broaden its impact on reversing species decline, supported five efforts in 2023: the **Red Panda Network** (Nepal); the **Wildlife Alliance** (focused on clouded leopards in Cambodia); **Florida International University** (focused on west African slender-snouted crocodiles); the **Pan African Sanctuary Alliance** (focused on drill monkeys in Cameroon); and the **Goulougo Triangle Ape Project** (focused on western lowland gorillas and central chimpanzees in the Congo Basin).

Just as it is vital to be able to continually broaden access to all the resources the Zoo has to offer, Zoo Atlanta also seeks to educate and inspire young people, especially those representing diverse communities, toward pathways to zoological and wildlife-related careers.

Joined by Drs. Vernard Hodges and Terrence Ferguson, stars of the series “Critter Fixers: Country Vets,” Zoo Atlanta hosted its first **Vet for a Day** on September 30.

With the help of the Zoo Atlanta Veterinary Team, schoolchildren from several locations in metro Atlanta had the opportunity to learn more about veterinary procedures, observe the Zoo team in action, and discuss academic paths to animal professions.

REMEMBERING

Dr. Jennifer Mickelberg

Zoo Atlanta was devastated by the tragic passing of **Jennifer Mickelberg, PhD**, Vice President of Collections and Conservation, on October 31. Jennifer's legacy is felt and missed in countless ways, both personally and professionally, within the Zoo Atlanta family and well beyond in the broader zoological community. Her most permanent legacy, however, will be left in the field of conservation. She devoted her career to the conservation of golden lion tamarins, an endangered species endemic to the Atlantic Coastal Forest of Brazil—a true success story of a species brought back from the brink of extinction.

The Golden Lion Tamarin Association, a conservation partner of Zoo Atlanta and an organization devoted to Jennifer and her work, pledged an especially meaningful memorial for her that will benefit the viability and long-term sustainability of this species with the creation of "**Jennifer's Forest Corridor**," a tract of restored forest which will connect fragmented tamarin populations and, when mature, will provide connected habitat for more than 3,000 golden lion tamarins.

Zoo Atlanta was thrilled to welcome Bob, a 1-year-old male Sumatran tiger, on November 29 on a recommendation from the AZA Sumatran Tiger Species Survival Plan® (SSP). Bob, who joins us in the John P. Imlay Tiger Habitat, represents one of the rarest mammal species at Zoo Atlanta, with fewer than 400 Sumatran tigers believed to remain in the wild.

A Zoo for **ALL**

Zoo Atlanta’s commitment to being “a Zoo for All” is a key aspect of our mission to ensure that the Zoo is an **inclusive, welcoming, and accessible** environment for all members of our community. 2023 brought a new event and the return of an important educational opportunity.



42 SAFARI CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS PROVIDED

Zoo Atlanta made 42 scholarships available for Summer Safari Camp with another year of the **Safari Camp Scholarship Program**. Funded by Cox Enterprises, the scholarships provided a week of Safari Camp for children ages 5 to 11 from Title One Schools in metro Atlanta.

The Zoo hosted its first **Family Pride Day** in fall 2023. The event invited guests to explore the rainbow of diversity and the many types of animal families found in the natural world with activity stations, a special themed Zoo Seekers program, and storybook readings.

Zoo Atlanta is a **respected resource for education** not just for thousands of Georgia students each year, but also for the families and individuals who are annually introduced to the Zoo experience, often for the first time.

In a new addition to its slate of education programs for people of all ages, Zoo Atlanta introduced **Rise and Dine with the Animals**, a morning opportunity to enjoy breakfast and speak with animal care professionals at select habitats around the Zoo, in 2023.

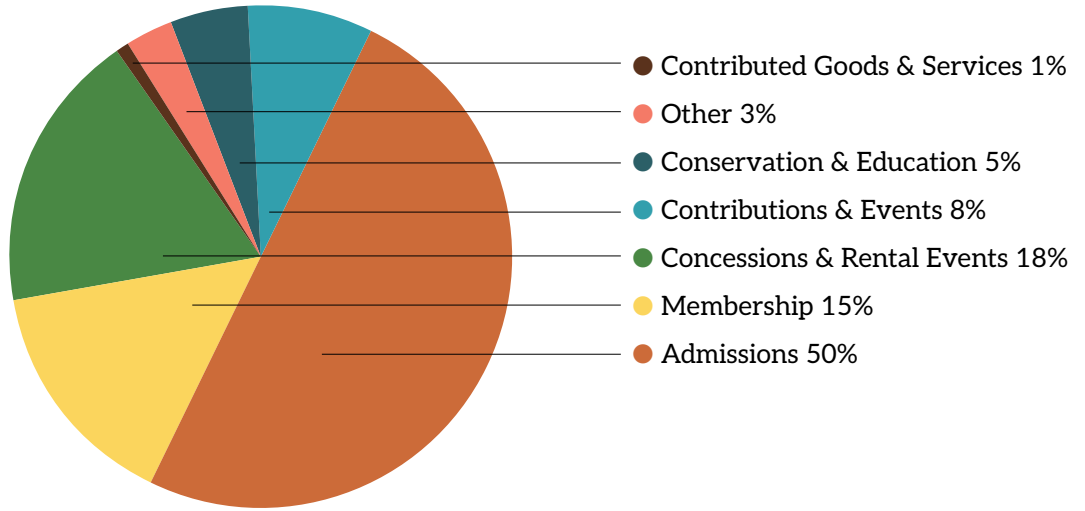

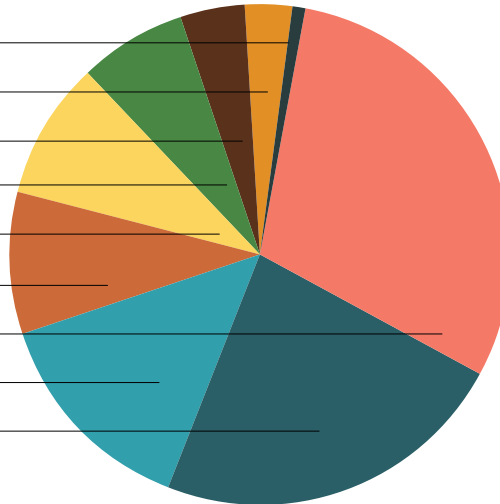

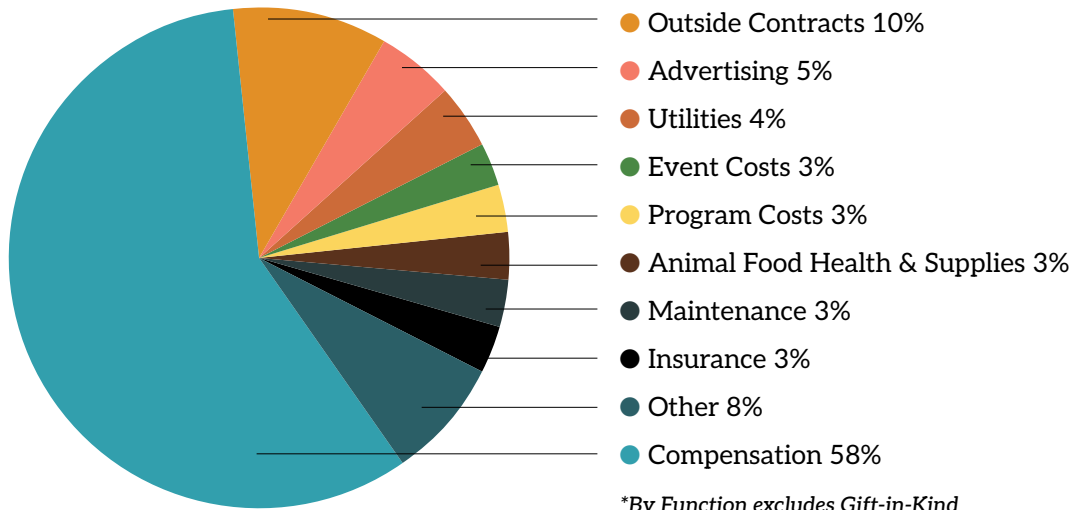
